## Last Month

Sedrick Harris of Melos Technologies gave an entertaining presentation. As expected, he used all Melos electronics: SE 75 monoblock amps, the new SHA Gold preamp, and CD player. A turntable was present, but due to a faulty tonearm cable, it wasn't used. Von Schweikert VR 4.5 speakers were used. There were several technical difficulties, but thanks to the persistence of the folks from Holm Audio (who graciously provided all of the equipment), the problems were solved and the system worked well. Thanks to Mike, Karl, and all the others who helped.

Sedrick, who had driven all the way from Florida, discussed features of the components as well as things going on at Melos. With regard to the new SHA Gold preamp, he mentioned older ones may be upgraded to current design for the difference in cost between the old and new versions.

Sedrick cracked some jokes and distributed free copies of The Audiophile Voice to all wanting them (thanks!). He mentioned the used LP business his wife is in, and the list of LPs available may be obtained from Rich Sacks.

Sedrick also described a few of his favorite cheap tweaks:

- (1) On turntables, use all brass screws and nuts for mounting the cartridge to the headshell.
- (2) His recommended record cleaning solution:
  - 1 part Everclear 180 proof grain alcohol (from your nearby liquor store)
  - 4 parts distilled water (would triple deionized water be better?)
  - 10 drops Photoflo wetting agent per gallon (from a photographic shop)
  - Alternately, you could use 1 part vodka and 2 parts distilled water (personally, I'd be a little concerned about impurities).
- (3) For subwoofers only, use 10 or 12 gauge transformer (magnet) wire for speaker cable.
