We were pleased to have Roger Sanders of Sanders Sound Systems (<u>http://www.sanderssoundsystems.com/</u>) present his new 10b Hybrid Electrostatic Loudspeaker with bass crossover/amplifier as well as his latest line stage and amplifiers. Roger Sanders has been designing electrostatic speakers since 1974 and in addition to numerous articles on electrostatic speakers, authored The Electrostatic Design Cookbook published by Audio Amateur in 1993.

Our thanks to our member John Burke Gallagher for arranging to have Roger Sanders and his equipment on hand. The speaker features 98 DB efficiency, bass response -2 db at 24 Hz, and an arc-proof design that can handle the output of any home amplifier. The following equipment was on hand:

Roger discussed at length his personal history with audio, overall design philosophy and preferences, and design criteria for the Sanders 10b speaker which he designs and builds himself in Colorado. His demo disk had excellent diverse material of various musical genres (many were taken with the Tommy Emmanuel jazz guitar track). With an arc-proof electrostatic design, a durable bass transmission line design, and dual 350 watt biamp capability at 8 ohms (and doubling down from there!) there were certainly no issues filling our 45' x 24' room with loud, clean, dynamic music! Due to the flat panels narrow horizontal dispersion (by design-to lessen room interaction) there were a relative few sweet spots set up in the center of the seating, but many in the back and other locations were also quite pleased with the sound. Our thanks to Rogers Sanders for all his efforts with an educational presentation, a unique, dynamic, and apparently quite durable electrostatic design ( a lifetime transferable warranty ). And thanks to our member, John Burke Gallagher for coordinating the equipment and Roger's visit.

## THE CLASSICAL CORNER

You know that old adage in audiophile circles that says the better a recording sounds the worse the performance will be? Well, I think that I have found a label that offers great music in terrific performances in outstanding sound. The Russian label Caro Mitis: <a href="https://www.caromitis.com/eng/index.html">www.caromitis.com/eng/index.html</a> makes their recordings using EMM Labs gear with editing and mixing being performed on a Pyramix system.

This is how recorded chamber music should sound. Lots of air around the instruments, with stable imaging and beautiful tonal color. So at this point I should probably tell you that the album I'm referring to is Preludes, & Ballet Suite by Dmitry Shostakovich performed by Alexei & Mikhail Utkin and the Hermitage Chamber Orchestra

(<u>http://www.caromitis.com/eng/catalogue/cm0082004.html</u>) The music is made up of transcription and arrangements of piano music and music from the ballets The Limpid Stream, The Bolt, and The Golden Age. The ballet music is a delight but my favorite is the Prelude and Fugue in C Minor. This arrangement for oboe, cello, and piano is a marvel and one that I will return to for its sheer musical pleasure.
