The Classical Corner

In April of 1945 American Lieutenant Charles von Stade was killed when his Jeep hit a land mine in Germany. On June1,1945 his daughter Frederica von Stade was born in New Jersey. While growing up she wanted to learn everything she could about her father. She was especially attracted to the letters Charles had written to his wife, Sara. Frederica grew up to become one of the most celebrated singers of her generation but always in the background was the father that she never knew.

During a conversation with conductor Roger Nierenberg, the subject of her father's letters came up and the idea was born to use them as the basis for a symphonic song cycle. New York based composer Richard Danielpour was commissioned to compose the music for this project. Kim Vaeth was given the task of creating a libretto from the letters of Charles. The result of this collaboration is 'Eligies' a song cycle for mezzo soprano, baritone, and orchestra.

The cycle consist of five songs. Baritone Thomas Hampson sings the part of the father, who is trapped in 1945. While Ms. von Stade sings the roll of the daughter, who lives in the present. This is heart felt music concerning a subject that is seldom approached in contempory music. This music is not an easy listen but I find myself going back to it again and again. This is music about what my parents generation endured and how it can and should affect us today.
