This Month's Meeting

<u>November 16th</u> Have You Heard This? Music Listening Session

You have some records and/or CDs you particularly enjoy. Whether it s the recording that s superb, the performance thrilling, or just the music that is especially relaxing or involving (or more than one of the above), there s something about them that you like.

Here s a great opportunity to play some of the music you like for others to enjoy. If you d like to say a few words about the recordings, by all means please do so. We ll list all which are played in the next newsletter in detail, with pertinent notes.

Musical tastes of members are wide ranging, including jazz, symphonic, rock, blues, choral, country, world music, new age, show tunes, and just about anything else which comes to mind. Let s spin some good vinyl and CDs to share interests, to discover recordings which we might otherwise miss. Isn t this a lot of what the Society is all about?

We ll have an excellent system on hand to play LPs and CDs, to reveal all of the nuances and dynamics of the music. So bring your music, and if you like, bring a friend to introduce him or her to fine audio and music. Last Month

It s hard to tell whether Harry Paller s stunning Technik Avant Garde Model One Signature preamplifier or his Vulcan 280 power amplifier got more attention, but my guess would be the preamp. It is in a class by itself, although various technical obstacles made such a conclusion a bit difficult. The rest of the system consisted of a Theta Data DS Pro Basic II CD transport, Analog Research D/A converter, Linn Sondek/Ittok/Asak turntable, XLO Signature and other interconnects, biwired Kimber 8TC speaker cables, ProAc Response 2.5 speakers, and Custom Power Cord Company power cords (thanks to David Blair for the digital front end, XLO interconnects, and power cords). Shakti stones were placed atop the preamp power supply and the amplifier power transformer for most of the meeting, but near the end they were removed (unfortunately, many people had left), removing the hardness (incorrectly) attributed to the CD playback system and making a significantly more musical, realistic sound. Clearly the CD playback system was excellent. Aural memory being what it is, the sound late in the day was similar to what was so enjoyable at the WCES last January in the Luxor Group s exhibit room.

The latest issue (#111) of *the absolute sound* includes some comments about the TAG preamp, rating it 3 out of 4 stars. Harry Paller and David
